Eight winning Eastern Cape Schools will spell to excel in Growsmart semi-finals

Spelling stars from eight Eastern Cape Schools have proven to be the best and brightest, winning the second level of the province's first ever Growsmart literacy competition.

These school's teams will be given the opportunity to shine again in the Growsmart semi-finals and finals, which will both be held on Saturday, 8 September 2018 at the East London International Convention Centre.

This is the first year that Growsmart, the leading education initiative by Growthpoint Properties in collaboration with the Eastern Cape Department of Education, is being offered in 60 schools in the province - 30 competing in East London, 30 competing in Port Elizabeth-.

Of the 60 schools taking part in the spelling competition designed to boost the literacy performance of primary school children, an excellent eight have made it through to the final rounds.

The East London second-round winners are Fanti Gaqa Primary, Khanyisa Primary, Nontuthuzelo Primary and RH Godlo Primary.

The second-round winners from Nelson Mandela Bay are Triomf Primary, Magqabi Primary, Machiu Primary and Caritas Primary.

Growsmart is a fun, competitive and exciting resource that is curriculum-based and helps educators and learners to master their required syllabus work. The programme provides all the materials and resources needed to excel in the competition, which is based on the schools' curriculum.

Growsmart schools are chosen by the Department of Education to improve their literacy performance. Growsmart targets learning in grades four, five and six, which is where the department has identified the potential to have the biggest possible impacts.

Jewel Harris, who heads Growsmart for Growthpoint, says: "We are impressed by the performance of the Eastern Cape schools as they embrace this collaborative approach to boost literacy in a meaningful and effective way. It is clear that this high-energy, high-impact programme is already having a positive impact in the Eastern Cape."

The Eastern Cape is the second South African province in which Growsmart is working to have meaningful, positive impacts on primary school performance.
